

DUAL ADMISSIONS AGREEMENT
MOUNT WACHUSETTS COMMUNITY COLLEGE
BECKER COLLEGE SCHOOL OF GRADUATE & PROFESSIONAL STUDIES
AS in Early Childhood/AS in Early Childhood and Care for Exceptional Students to
BA in Early Childhood and Youth Education

Mount Wachusett Community College (MWCC) and the School of Graduate & Professional Studies at Becker College ("Becker") enter into this Dual Admission Agreement ("Agreement") in order that students admitted into the AS in Early Childhood or AS in Early Childhood and Care for Exceptional Students program at MWCC will be admitted into the BA in Early Childhood and Youth Education program in the School of Graduate & Professional Studies at Becker.

Eligibility for Dual Admission

A student must meet the following requirements:

- Be a graduate of the AS in Early Childhood or AS in Early Childhood and Care for Exceptional Students program at MWCC.

(See Appendix A and B for program course requirements.)

- Have earned a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for college courses completed prior to admission.

All coursework from the sending program must be completed with grades of "D" or better in order to transfer. Becker will accept up to 90 credits in transfer, which includes credit earned toward the AS degree and other coursework a student may have completed. Transfer credits from institutions other than MWCC will be evaluated on an individual basis.

Dual Admissions Student Responsibilities

- Students must apply to Becker and submit official transcripts from all universities/colleges attended.
- MWCC students who fulfill the requirements for the Dual Admission program will be guaranteed acceptance into the bachelor's degree program at Becker.
- Students must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA to be in good standing in the Dual Admission program.
- Students must enroll within one year of MWCC graduation.
- Students who attend another institution between the time they graduate from MWCC and enroll at Becker must apply as transfer students to Becker and are not eligible for dual admission.
- Students will comply with all applicable MWCC and Becker policies, rules, regulations and conduct codes.

Institutions' Responsibilities

- Becker will provide dual admissions students from MWCC a 25% tuition discount for courses taken through the School of Graduate & Professional Studies at Becker College.
- Both institutions will track Dual Admissions students in their information systems.
- MWCC and Becker will assign each student an advisor.
- The colleges agree to include information about this articulation agreement in relevant publications for the purposes of promotion and advising.
- The colleges agree to jointly develop appropriate transfer guides and make these available to students and advisors as appropriate.
- The colleges agree to notify each other promptly, in writing, of substantive changes in curricula that might affect the Agreement.

Term

- This agreement will be effective from the date of the final signatures below.

unless terminated or amended by either party with ninety (90) days' prior written notice. However, such termination shall not take effect with regard to students already enrolled until such a time as those students have completed their respective course of study.

- This Agreement does not preclude either college from entering into similar agreements with other institutions of higher education.
