MINIMUM ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must be a currently licensed practical nurse in good standing with at least six months of experience as an LPN and must meet all requirements and submit all documentation listed on page 1.
- Credit is awarded for NUR111 to currently licensed practical nurses when verification of license is received by admissions.
- Applicants must have completed **ENG101, PSY105, BIO203 and MAT143** (with a grade of C+ or greater).
- Those accepted students who have not completed PSY110, BIO204 and BIO205, will be required to complete these courses before beginning NUR115, NUR220 and NUR230.
- Courses in progress at time of application deadline will not be considered as meeting these requirements.
- Your file will be reviewed and you will be notified by mail of the decision approximately 60 days following the application deadline.
- Science and math courses older than 10 years are not accepted.
- Applicants must be proficient in math. Competency may be met with completion of a math course equal to MAT143 with a grade of C+ or greater or through college placement testing. Math courses cannot be older than 10 years.

SPECIAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS FOR NU AND PN

Please note that the following information must be received before courses begin:

- Students accepted to Health Programs must be in compliance with the current immunization requirements specified by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health for Health Care Personnel (HCP) and in accordance with state law, MGL, Chapter 76, Section 15C and its regulations at 105 CMR 220.700 in order to participate in an externship placement or clinical experience.
- Health examination conducted within the past two years by a licensed healthcare provider.
- Immunization Requirements for Health Science Students: Two (2) doses Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine or positive titre; two (2) doses MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) vaccine or positive titers; three (3) doses Hepatitis B vaccine AND Hepatitis B titer showing immunity to the disease; one (1) TDAP (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccine within 10 years; one (1) dose Meningococcal vaccine (ages 16-21); annual Influenza vaccine; initial "2 step" PPD or Quantiferon Gold TB blood test or an annual TB testing (negative chest x-ray within 5 years AND annual TB Questionnaire also accepted); a complete physical exam within two years. Contact Health Svcs at 978-630-9136 for more information.
- Liability Insurance of \$1,000,000/\$3,000,000 coverage is required. Students will be covered under the college's liability insurance policy, which will be billed through student fees.
- CPR Certification (Healthcare Provider) or BLS level is required by the American Health Association. A certificate of completion must be presented to the nursing department prior to entry into nursing courses.
- All nursing students must participate in the Massachusetts Community College Health Insurance Plan or provide accurate information regarding comparable coverage.
- Clinical sites may require the student obtain certain background checks (state/federal criminal or sexual offender), finger printing and/or drug testing before participating in the clinical experience. Costs for these reviews will be the responsibility of the student.

TECHNICAL STANDARDS

Students entering these programs must be able to demonstrate the ability to:

- Comprehend textbook material at the 11th grade level.
- Communicate and assimilate information either in spoken, printed, signed, or computer voice format.
- Gather, analyze, and draw conclusions from data.
- Stand for a minimum of two hours.
- Walk for a minimum of six hours, not necessarily consecutively.
- Stoop, bend, and twist for a minimum of 30 minutes at a time and be able to repeat this activity at frequent intervals.
- Lift a 40-pound person or assist with a larger person and transfer the person from one location to another.
- Determine by touch: hotness/coldness, wetness/dryness, hardness/softness.
- Use the small muscle dexterity necessary to do such tasks as gloving, gowning, and operating controls on machinery.
- Respond to spoken words, monitor signals, call bells, and vital sign assessment equipment.
- Identify behaviors that would endanger a person's life or safety and intervene quickly in a crisis situation with an appropriate solution.
- Remain calm, rational, decisive, and in control at all times, especially during emergency situations.
- Exhibit social skills appropriate to professional interactions.
- Maintain cleanliness and personal grooming consistent with close personal contact.
- Function without causing harm to self or others if under the influence of prescription or over-the-counter medications.
- Read measurement units with or without corrective lenses.

Students are expected to meet the technical standards for enrollment in college programs. In some cases, assessment and developmental courses may help students meet these standards. Technical standards must be met with or without accommodations. The college complies with the requirements of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. BACKGROUND CHECKS, DRUG TESTING AND LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS

A Criminal Offender Records Information (CORI) review procedure has been implemented for students whose academic programs includes the potential for unsupervised contact with persons from vulnerable populations (i.e., children, the elderly and the disabled).

As part of the coursework in the LPN Bridge to AS Nursing program, students are required to complete practical hours in clinical facilities working with patients under the supervision of licensed providers. Clinical sites may require the student obtain certain background checks (state/federal criminal or sexual offender), finger printing and/or drug testing before participating in the clinical experience. Costs for these reviews will be the responsibility of the student.

Refusing to participate in these background checks or drug testing will result in the inability to progress in the program. A positive background check or drug test may also result in the inability to progress in the program.

The prospective student is encouraged to discuss any concerns with the program director prior to acceptance into the LPN Bridge to AS Nursing program. All screenings and background checks are completed AFTER admission/acceptance into the program.

Applicants for initial Massachusetts nurse licensure (RN & PN) must report felonies and misdemeanors, convictions and disciplinary action to the Board of Registration in Nursing for its evaluation of the applicant's compliance with the Good Moral Character requirement at FL, c.112, ss.74 and 74A. For details, refer to the Good Moral Character Information Sheet at mass.gov/dpl/boards/rn/forms/gmcreg.pdf.

By signing this application, the prospective student understands his/her responsibility to participate in and pay for these background checks/drug tests, if required by the clinical site. By signing this application, the prospective student also understands the consequences of refusing to test, or refusing to undergo the background checks.

READMISSION OR TRANSFER APPLICANTS:

Readmission to the nursing program is not guaranteed and is offered on a space available basis. Readmission to the program will require successful completion of a readmission competency examination(s). A student seeking readmission to the nursing program must submit a separate application for readmission and meet all of the requirements of general applicants. Students are limited to two admissions (one initial admission and one readmission) in the nursing program. If students are not successful in passing the readmission exam(s), that is considered their second attempt at admission. Mount Wachusett Community College reserves the right to limit the number of readmissions each academic year. The respective programs reserve the right to refuse readmission based on, but not limited to, unprofessional behavior, unethical conduct, and client safety issues. To be considered for readmission, applicants must submit a letter of intent to the Director of Admissions and to the Director of Nursing.

ACCREDITATION

The program is approved by the Massachusetts Board of Nursing. Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, ACEN, Board of Commissioners granted continuing accreditation to the associate nursing program. QUESTION AND ANSWERS

How do I make an appointment to complete my placement testing?

If you have not yet completed college level English and Math, your next step is to take the placement exam. Students may take the placement exam on any of our 3 campuses and options at each of those campuses vary. For more information, please check mwcc.edu/testing or contact Testing Services at 978-630-9244. If you completed placement testing in the past three years, these scores can be used if they meet the program requirements. An additional fee of \$10.00 will be charged for those individuals who request to retest.

If I do not meet the math, science, English, psychology and NUR111 and TEAS requirements by deadline, will my file be reviewed?

No, unfortunately your file will not go to committee. Only those applications displaying the requirements, TEAS scores, and prerequisites at time of deadline will be reviewed (see minimum requirements for consideration).

I have not completed the coursework needed to apply to the nursing program yet. Can I still come to MWCC?

YES! Students are encouraged to enter the college as a "Allied Health Concentration (IDSH)" student. With this major, you will be identified as a potential nursing applicant and will be assigned an advisor that will assist you in establishing an educational plan. As a IDSH student, you may complete any of your co-requisite courses (i.e., English, mathematics, sciences, psychology, etc.) then apply to the program when you have met the requirements for consideration.

How is my file evaluated?

Our nursing class is selected from a pool of applicants who have displayed the minimum academic requirements for admission to the program. Space is limited and not all applicants are accepted. Applications will be reviewed and candidates will be notified of the admission decision by mail approximately 60 days after the deadline. The process is competitive and your file will be ranked using the following criteria:

- Current LPN license in good standing and six months or more work experience
- HS Diploma or HiSET (GED) completion
- TEAS results
- Math Proficiency: Competency may be met with completion of a math course equal to MAT143 with a C+ or greater or through college placement testing.
- Courses completed and grades received

Courses Completed and Grades Received:

An applicant must have completed Anatomy & Physiology I (BIO203) minimum of a C+ and not older than 10 years, English Composition I (ENG 101), Intro to Psychology (PSY 105), Math 143 with a minimum of a C+ and not older than 10 years. Due to the competitive nature of selection, some applicants will complete the following General Education courses prior to program entrance. These courses include: English Composition II (ENG 102), Human Growth & Development (PSY 110), Introduction to Sociology (SOC 103), Anatomy & Physiology II (BIO 204 - 4 credits), and Microbiology (BIO 205 - 4 credits) with grades of C+ or better and not older than ten years.

If I am not accepted this year, will I automatically be accepted next year?

No, you are not guaranteed acceptance. All applicants must reapply.

Is there a pre-admission entrance examination?

Yes. Mount Wachusett Community College requires students to complete the TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills). For information regarding the TEAS see the following website mwcc.edu/services/testing/TEAS. You may register for the exam on-line at atitesting.com.

Where do I attend a clinical setting or placement, and how do I get there?

Nursing students are responsible for their own transportation to clinical sites which include healthcare agencies in such areas as Worcester, Leominster, Fitchburg, Ayer, Baldwinville, Athol, Gardner, Concord and Groton.

Can I transfer to a four-year school and earn a Bachelor's Degree?

Yes. Graduating nursing students may take advantage of several RN to BSN bridge programs. Transfer articulation agreements currently exist between MWCC and Elms College, Fitchburg State University and Rivier University. This includes the new MWCC/Fitchburg State Guaranteed Admission Nursing Program. Your acceptance to MWCC's Associate Degree in Nursing program offers you conditional admission to Fitchburg State's BS in Nursing program. Upon graduation from MWCC's Nursing program and passing the NCLEX-RN exam, you may begin your courses in the RN-BS program at Fitchburg State. Students will be contacted in their final semester at MWCC to discuss the transition to Fitchburg State. Can I apply for Financial Aid?

Yes. Inquire at the Financial Aid Office, 978-630-9169. We encourage all applicants to apply for Financial Aid, using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), available at fafsa.gov.

Additionally, what must I know?

- It is up to the applicant to read the Technical Standards. It is the applicants responsibility to discuss any accommodation that he/she may need by contacting the Counselor for Students with Disabilities at 978-630-9330.
- The applicant is responsible for ensuring that the application file is complete and that all items are received by the deadline.
- A CORI positive finding may prevent an applicant from successfully completing the nursing program and may prohibit them from taking the NCLEX-RN.

Information Sessions

The Office of Admissions offers monthly information sessions that include program information and the admission process. Attendance at an information session is required. Transcript reviews are not conducted at these sessions. Please call 978-630-9110 for information.

2021 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS- (SELECTIVE)

MWCC offers current licensed LPNs a Bridge Program to complete requirements for the Associate Degree in Nursing. Credit is given for the first semester (NUR111) of the associate degree program allowing applicants to enter second semester nursing courses. Interested candidates must meet minimum requirements for consideration and apply by the deadline.

Helpful hints:

Because of an extensive classroom/clinical commitment, students are encouraged to complete general education requirements prior to beginning nursing courses.

Transfer options:

Graduating nursing students may take advantage of several RN to BSN bridge programs. Transfer articulation agreements currently exist between MWCC and Elms College, Fitchburg State University and Rivier University. This includes the new MWCC/Fitchburg State Guaranteed Admission Nursing Program. Your acceptance to MWCC's Associate Degree in Nursing program offers you conditional admission to Fitchburg State's BS in Nursing program. Upon graduation from MWCC's Nursing program and passing the NCLEX-RN exam, you may begin your courses in the RN-BS program at Fitchburg State. Students will be contacted in their final semester at MWCC to discuss the transition to Fitchburg State. Application deadline:

The priority application deadline for admission is November 15, 2020. This selective enrollment program requires additional application components. The process is competitive, and space is limited.

Special requirements:

Applicants must meet all requirements for consideration before entering the program. Students must meet technical standards and additional requirements including immunizations, CPR certification, liability insurance, and a Criminal/Offender Records Information (CORI) check. Additional tuition applies for the Nursing program. (See college catalog for more information.)

Requirements for Consideration:

Applicants must be currently licensed LPN's (with six months work experience) and must meet all the same requirements as those of the A.S. Nursing Degree. In addition, applicants must have completed ENG101, MAT143 (with a grade of C+ or greater), PSY105, BIO203 (formerly BIO199) (with a grade of C+ or greater), passing score on both Maternity & Pediatric ATI exam or successful completion of NUR115 with grade 77 or greater.

Due to the competitive nature of selection, applicants are encouraged to complete the following General Education courses prior to program entrance. These courses include: English Composition II (ENG 102), Human Growth & Development (PSY 110), Introduction to Sociology (SOC 103), Anatomy & Physiology II (BIO 204 - 4 credits), and Microbiology (BIO 205 - 4 credits) with grades of C+ or better and not older than ten years.

Career options:

RNs in hospitals, sub acute units, extended care facilities, medical offices, rehabilitation centers, and home care.

Coursework and Clinical Schedule:

ATI Exam:

Students selected for the LPN to Bridge Program will be given the ATI exams on Maternity and Pediatric in February/March. Demonstrated proficiency through NLN examinations in Maternity (OB) and Pediatrics may also be considered for exemption from NUR115.

NUR 115:

Those students who do not reach the passing exam score of level 2 or 3 will take NUR115.
