MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSIDERATION

A.S. ADVANCED STANDING NURSING DEGREE (DAY PROGRAM. CLASSES BEGIN IN JANUARY.)

General Applicants:

Applicants must have completed the following at time of application:

1. Math Proficiency: Competency may be met with completion of a math course equal to MAT143 with a C+ or greater.
2. Applicants are strongly encouraged to complete all non-nursing pre and co-requisite coursework prior to applying to the program due to the competitive admission requirements of the program.
3. Completion of BIO203 (Anatomy & Physiology (4 credits) completed at an accredited college with a grade of C+ or greater), ENG101, PSY105 and previous nursing courses with a 3.0 GPA or greater.

Your file will be reviewed and you will be notified by mail of the decision approximately 60 days following the application deadline.

Courses in progress at time of application deadline will not be considered as meeting these requirements.

SPECIAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Please note that the following information must be received before courses begin:

- Students accepted to Health Programs must be in compliance with the current immunization requirements specified by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health for Health Care Personnel (HCP) and in accordance with state law, MGL, Chapter 76, Section 15C and its regulations at 105 CMR 220.700 in order to participate in an externship placement or clinical experience.
- Health examination conducted within the past two years by a licensed healthcare provider.
- Immunization Requirements for Health Science Students: Two (2) doses Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine or positive titre; two (2) doses MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) vaccine; three (3) doses Hepatitis B vaccine AND Hepatitis B titer showing immunity to the disease; one (1) TDAP (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccine within 10 years; one (1) dose Meningococcal vaccine (ages 16-21); annual Influenza vaccine; initial "2 step" PPD or Quantiferon Gold TB blood test and then annual TB testing (negative chest x-ray within 5 years AND annual TB Questionnaire also accepted); a complete physical exam within two years. - Liability Insurance of \$1,000,000/\$3,000,000 coverage is required. Students will be covered under the college's liability insurance policy, which will be billed through student fees.
- CPR Certification (Healthcare Provider) or BLS level is required. A certificate of completion must be presented to the nursing department prior to entry into nursing courses.
- All nursing students must participate in the Massachusetts Community College Health Insurance Plan or provide accurate information regarding comparable coverage.
- Students are required to have a computer or laptop with working camera.
- Clinical sites may require the student obtain certain background checks (state/federal criminal or sexual offender), finger printing and/or drug testing before participating in the clinical experience. Costs for these reviews will be the responsibility of the student.

TECHNICAL STANDARDS

Students entering this program must be able to demonstrate the ability to:

1. Comprehend textbook material at the 11th grade level.
2. Communicate and assimilate information either in spoken, printed, signed, or computer voice format.
3. Gather, analyze, and draw conclusions from data.
4. Stand for a minimum of two hours.
5. Walk for a minimum of six hours, not necessarily consecutively.
6. Stoop, bend, and twist for a minimum of 30 minutes at a time and be able to repeat this activity at frequent intervals.
7. Lift a 40-pound person or assist with a larger person and transfer the person from one location to another.
8. Determine by touch: hotness/coldness, wetness/dryness, hardness/softness.
9. Use the small muscle dexterity necessary to do such tasks as gloving, gowning, and operating controls on machinery.
10. Read measurement units with or without corrective lenses.
11. Respond to spoken words, monitor signals, call bells, and vital sign assessment equipment.
12. Identify behaviors that would endanger a person's life or safety and intervene quickly in a crisis situation with an appropriate solution.
13. Remain calm, rational, decisive, and in control at all times, especially during emergency situations.
14. Exhibit social skills appropriate to professional interactions.
15. Maintain cleanliness and personal grooming consistent with close personal contact.
16. Function without causing harm to self or others if under the influence of prescription or over-the-counter medications.

Students are expected to meet the technical standards for enrollment in college programs. In some cases, assessment and developmental courses may help students meet these standards. Technical standards must be met with or without accommodations. The college complies with the requirements of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. BACKGROUND CHECKS, DRUG TESTING AND LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS

A Criminal Offender Records Information (CORI) review procedure has been implemented for students whose academic programs includes the potential for unsupervised contact with persons from vulnerable populations (i.e., children, the elderly and the disabled).

As part of the coursework in the AS Nursing Advanced Standing program, students are required to complete practical hours in clinical facilities working with patients under the supervision of licensed providers. Clinical sites may require the student obtain certain background checks (state/federal criminal or sexual offender), finger printing and/or drug testing before participating in the clinical experience. Costs for these reviews will be the responsibility of the student.

Refusing to participate in these background checks or drug testing will result in the inability to progress in the program. A positive background check or drug test may also result in the inability to progress in the program.

The prospective student is encouraged to discuss any concerns with the program director prior to acceptance into the A.S. Nursing Advanced Standing program. All screenings and background checks are completed AFTER admission/acceptance into the program.

Applicants for initial Massachusetts nurse licensure (RN & PN) must report felonies and misdemeanors, convictions and disciplinary action to the Board of Registration in AS Nursing program for its evaluation of the applicant's compliance with the Good Moral Character requirement at FL, c.112, ss.74 and 74A. By signing this application, the prospective student understands his/her responsibility to participate in and pay for these background checks/drug tests, if required by the clinical site. By signing this application, the prospective student also understands the consequences of refusing to test, or refusing to undergo the background checks.

ACCREDITATION

The program is approved by the Massachusetts Board of Nursing. QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

If I do not meet the math, English, psychology, NUR111, science requirements & TEAS by deadline, will my file be reviewed?

No, unfortunately your file will not go to committee. Only those applications displaying the requirements & TEAS at time of deadline will be reviewed (see minimum requirements for consideration).

I haven't completed the coursework needed to apply to the nursing program yet. Can I still come to MWCC?

YES! Students are encouraged to enter the college as a "Interdisciplinary Studies - Allied Health (IDSH)" student. With this major, you will be identified as a potential nursing applicant and will be assigned an advisor who will assist you in establishing an educational plan. As an IDSH student, you may complete any of your co-requisite courses (i.e., English, mathematics, sciences, psychology, etc.) then apply to the program when you have met the requirements for consideration.

Can I speak with an advisor about the Nursing Program?

Yes, it is required that you attend a Healthcare information session and meet with a representative from the Nursing and Admissions departments. **Please call 978-630-9110 and reserve a seat! Healthcare information session are listed on mwcc.edu/info-sessions/**

How is my file evaluated?

Our nursing class is selected from a pool of applicants who have displayed the minimum academic requirements for admission to the program. Space is limited and not all applicants are accepted. Applications will be reviewed and candidates will be notified of the admissions decision by mail approximately 60 days after the deadline. The process is competitive and your file will be ranked using the following criteria:

- All students must have graduated with a HS Diploma or HiSET (GED). Students, who have completed secondary school outside the US, must have their records evaluated by a recognized credential agency. Please refer to naces.org for more information.
- TEAS results.
- Math Proficiency: Competency may be met with completion of a math course equal to MAT143 with a C+ or greater and not older than 10 years or through college placement testing.
- Completion of BIO203 (formerly BIO199) (Anatomy & Physiology I), ENG101 (English Composition I), and PSY105 (Introduction to Psychology) with a C+ or higher.
- Must have NUR106, NUR111 or equivalent with a 3.0 GPA or greater transferred in or LPN license in good standing.
- An applicant must have completed Anatomy & Physiology I (4 credits) within the last 10 years. Due to the competitive nature of selection, applicants are encouraged to complete BIO204 (Anatomy & Physiology II), BIO205 (Microbiology), ENG102 (English Composition II), PSY110 (Human Growth & Development) and SOC103 (Introduction to Sociology) with a C+ or greater.
- An applicant's prior degree(s) are taken into consideration.
- An applicant's work experience is taken into consideration; more specifically, applicants who have worked or are working in indirect or direct healthcare positions.
- Current MWCC students will be given priority in the evaluation process.

If I am not accepted this year, will I automatically be accepted next year?

No, you are not guaranteed acceptance. All applicants must reapply.

Is there a pre-admission entrance examination?

Yes. Mount Wachusett Community College requires students to complete the TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills). For more information, contact the College Testing Services office at 978-630-9244. To register for the TEAS, go online to atitesting.com.

Can I work and attend classes full-time?

Nursing and science coursework is complex and requires a personal commitment. Part-time employment may be appropriate, but will need to be flexible in order to accommodate school requirements. Students are encouraged to balance their employment and school responsibilities.

Where do I attend a clinical setting or placement, and how do I get there?

Nursing students are responsible for their own transportation to clinical sites which include healthcare agencies in such areas as Worcester, Leominster, Fitchburg, Ayer, Baldwinville, Athol, Gardner, and Groton.

Can I transfer to a four-year school and earn a Bachelor's Degree?

Yes. Graduating nursing students may take advantage of several RN to BSN bridge programs. Transfer articulation agreements currently exist between MWCC and Elms College, Fitchburg State University and Rivier University. This includes the new MWCC/Fitchburg State Guaranteed Admission Nursing Program. Your acceptance to MWCC's Associate Degree in Nursing program offers you conditional admission to Fitchburg State's BS in Nursing program. Upon graduation from MWCC's Nursing program and passing the NCLEX-RN exam, you may begin your courses in the RN-BS program at Fitchburg State.
